Professor Dr. Atiyah Hussein Afandi

Prof. Dr. Atiyah Hussein Afandi is considered one of the leading scholars in public administration. He earned his bachelor's degree in Political Science from the Faculty of Economics and Political Science, Cairo University, in 1968. He then obtained a master's degree in Political Science in 1977 and a Doctorate in 1983, also from the Faculty of Economics and Political Science, Cairo University. He served as the Head of the Department of Public Administration at the faculty from 1999 to 2005.

Prof. Dr. Afandi has made significant research contributions and has reviewed manuscripts for several Egyptian and Arab academic journals, including "Gulf and Arabian Peninsula Studies," Kuwait; "King Abdulaziz University Journal," Saudi Arabia; "Studies," Jordan University; publications of the "Arab Administrative Development Organization," Cairo; and "Al-Nahda" magazine, published by the Faculty of Economics and Political Science, Cairo University. He has also reviewed numerous promotion research papers for faculty members in the field of public administration at various Egyptian and Arab universities.
